Safety Update

Last month I mentioned a few reminders of some of TCSL safety rules. I talked about rules for bring firearms to the firing line, procedure for going down range, and types of targets. This month I would like to continue with some reminders of TCSL range rules and procedures.

Target Placement—Target placement is very important in helping to assure the bullets stay contained within the TCSL property. All targets must be placed in front of the proper backstop. On the Rifle, Pistol, and Action ranges, this means the earth berms.

On the Pistol and Rifle ranges, the firing line is at the fixed location. Shooters may not shoot from any other position, other than the firing line. On the Pistol range and 50-yard rifle range, target distance may be varied by moving the target closer or farther from the firing line. On the Action Range, the... Continued \Im

target should be placed as near to the berm as possible. The shooter may vary the distance by moving their firing position closer or farther from the target. However, in no case should the shooter's firing position be beyond the wooden walls. Also, on the 100-yard and 200-yard Rifle ranges, the target placement is to be nearest the berm as possible.

Another consideration in target placement is the vertical positioning. On the 100-yard and 200-yard Rifle ranges, a general rule of thumb would be not to place the target any higher than 5 feet off the ground. This should allow an adequate view of the target, from the firing line, and assure the bullets impact the berm.

On the Action range and Pistol range, targets should be placed no higher than eye level of the shooter. Remember that "eye level" is determined by the shooter height AND shooting position. For example if targets are set for being shot from a standing position, and then the shooter decided to shoot from seated, the target MUST be lowered to reflect this lower shooting position. This target placement is important in assuring that the bullets impact the berm and not the ground, the shoot house structure (cross beams) OR go over the berm.

On the Action range, there is an option to shoot a plate rack. The rack has been set into a location closest to the berm and a shroud has been placed overhead. It is important that the shooters DO NOT move these from their position. The placement is set to allow for the most efficient containment of splatter from bullets impacting the plates. Also, it is important that the shooter be no closer than 10 yards to the plate rack. This is approximation the distance of the reset pull cord. The purpose of this distance is to reduce the shooter being hit from splatter. Finally, with regard to the plate rack, it is designed to fall from the hit from ONE bullet. DO NOT DOUBLE TAP the plates. Doing so causes the second hit to strike while the plate is in a falling position ant the splatter may not be contained by the shroud.

Summer Military Rifle Matches Begin April 16th

The final Winter bench-rest Military Rifle Match was held on March 19, 2016. Due to attendance two relays were held. Rifles represented included; AR-15's, M14, M1A, FN SCAR 16, M1903 Springfield, Russian Mosin-Nagant, m/96 Swedish Mauser and a Lee-Enfield Mk III.

Tom Meadows was the overall winner of the match with a score of 95 out of 100, followed by Ted Meadows with a 94 and Mark Smokowicz with a 92. All shooters used iron sights. Thanks to Dave Vandermark, Gerry Marken, and Jon Jaeger for assisting at the event.



Special Operations Forces Combat Assault Rifle (SCAR)

An FN SCAR 16 was used in the match, which is the semi-auto only version of the newest service rifle of U.S. special operators - Special Operations Forces Combat Assault Rifle (SCAR). It is a gas-operated (short-stroke gas piston) self-loading rifle with a rotating bolt and is constructed to be extremely modular. The SCAR-L, for "light", is chambered in the 5.56×45mm NATO cartridge and the SCAR-H, for "heavy", fires 7.62×51mm NATO. Both are available in Long Barrel and Close Quarters Combat variants. Light, fast-handling and quick shooting, features a free-floating, cold hammerforged MIL-SPEC barrel with chromelined bore, with fully-ambidextrous operating controls and a telescoping, sidefolding polymer stock and three MIL-STD 1913 accessory rails for mounting lights, lasers, etc. The military version has a quick-change barrel feature, which is not offered on the civilian model. Another variant is the (EGLM) military **Enhanced Grenade Launching Module,** a 40mm grenade launcher. This is the rifle that the U.S. Army said it wanted, finding that the FN SCAR was almost 4x more reliable than the M4.

Our first **Summer Military Rifle Match** will be held on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 16</u>. Registration begins at 9am and the... *Continued* $\$

match starts at 10am. The match is open to members (\$10) and guests (\$15). To compete all you need is a military style rifle (non-automatic), domestic or foreign, vintage or modern, sporterized or customized, scoped or iron sights. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone positon for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score: (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing unsupported position. For the Slow fire portion, single fed rounds are fired within 10 minutes, while Rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match.
