
Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, September 17, 2016. Registration begins at 9am and the match starts at 10am. The match is open to members \$10 and guests \$15. To compete all you need is a military style rifle (non-automatic), domestic or foreign, vintage or modern, sporterized or customized, scoped or iron sights. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses, and ear protection. Spotting scopes and slings are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone positon for sight-in within five minutes. For score: (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position and (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing unsupported position. For the Slow fire portion, single fed rounds are fired within ten minutes, while Rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match.

More about IDPA

If you are interested in learning defensive handgun shooting techniques, IDPA is a great way not only to learn but also to practice your skill development. The equipment requirements are basic and easy for most to acquire—a revolver or high caliber handgun (9mm, 40 or 45), a holster, three pistol magazines and a double magazine pouch for your belt. Revolver shooters use speed loaders or moon clips to practice faster reloading. Some folks shoot/practice using their concealed carry gun but most use tactical gear designed for the sport. In any case, it is easy to get started. You can select from six divisions: SSP Stock Service Pistol, ESP Enhanced Service Pistol, CDP Custom Defensive Pistol, REV Revolver; plus new divisions added recently: CCP Compact Carry Pistol and BUG Backup Gun. To learn more about each of these, look them up on the Web. There are also five 'classifications' for shooting the sport, however, you do not have to be classified to come to practice or shoot local matches. The classifications are Novice, Marksman, Sharpshooter, Expert, and Master. Each indicates advanced skill levels in speed and accuracy.

The State Match was held last weekend at the Brooklyn Sportsman's Club. 330 persons registered to shoot this year and about 50 volunteers helped to make the match a success. Shooters came from the great lakes regional states but also from NC, KY, TN, and FL. The BSC team designed 11 shooting stages that were not only creative but proved to be very challenging. Bob Vogel, a nationally recognized Master IDPA shooter provided an advanced pistol techniques class, which was extremely popular. The best news for us is TCSL Member Pam Hasselbach

received the 'High Lady Award' for the best score among women participants! Congratulations Pam!

At our monthly match this weekend, 78 shooters registered including the 13 Safety Officers needed to run the stages. A downpour of unexpected rain for about an hour did not deter most of the shooters who waited out the storm to finish the match.
