President's Column

Mid November the annual deer firearm season arrives. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources in its 2016 Michigan Deer Hunting Prospects report states in part as follows:

- Fewer hunters went deer hunting in 2015; however, there was a small increase in the number of deer that were harvested.
- In 2015, the number of successful hunters in the Upper Peninsula declined while there was an increase in the number of successful hunters. Four out of every ten hunters in the Lower Peninsula killed at least one deer.
- Expectations are that due to the harsh, long 2012, 2013, and 2014 winters there will continue to be fewer deer in the Upper Peninsula but the mild 2015 may end up resulting in the success of more hunters than last year.
- The number of 2.5–3.5 year old deer in the Upper Peninsula will be low, also as a result of the 2012–2014 harsh winters.
- The Lower Peninsula may have a slight increase in the number of deer killed.

When you get your deer this year take a photo and send it to us so we can post some on our webpage or in our newsletter.

You may enjoy the [2017 Michigan Deer & Turkey Expo](#) which is on Friday, February 17, 2017 through Sunday, February 19, 2017. It will be held at the Lansing Center, 333 E. Michigan Avenue, Lansing, MI 48933. There will be exhibitions, contests, and seminars.

At the upcoming November 17, 2016 Board meeting, a nominating committee will be approved by the board and given the task of trying to get the February 2017 ballot put together with candidates for each position. If you want to throw your hat into the ring, I would suggest you do so before the end of this year with the understanding that nominations can also be made from the floor at the January 2017 meeting.

During this summer, Tri-County held six Bowling Pin Shoots on one of the action bays at the Pistol Range. This year over 240 shooters took the challenge by stepping up to the firing line, located 25 feet away from a table with five bowling pins on it. After being given the command to “load and make ready”, they waited for the words “shooter ready... stand by”, and at the sound of the beep from the shot timer, they quickly raised their firearm and began shooting until all five pins were knocked down. After unloading and making sure their firearm was safe, they were told by the range officer the results of their efforts.

Some shooters smiled, some sighed, but 99% of the time, they bought another chance to try again. Adrenalin, and the friendly rivalry in conversations, are the main ingredients that can be found at this type of event. Participants were members and non-members who brought along family and friends. In the end, no one was a loser. Building skills and confidence was another benefit of this event.

Last week was the last IDPA match at TCSL. Attendance was lower, about 58 shooters, due to the colder weather. We had five stages and thankfully, the volunteers needed to run the match. We are all grateful for the time devoted by volunteers to setup, manage, and officiate the matches! There is a lot to be done each month to host all of the people that come to the club to shoot IDPA—website updates, stage designs, stage setup on Friday evenings, arriving early on Saturday to complete the setup, IT work for the score keeping (electronically), managing the sign in and money collection, food preparation, two Safety Officers per stage, Match Director, and finally teardown of the stages. Maintenance of the action bays and props used for shooting is ongoing but the love of this sport by so many people keeps the momentum up each season.

We will not be hosting IDPA shooting until next spring but other clubs run some winter matches and indoor ranges like Ann Arbor Arms, Top Gun, and the Firing Line offer moving and shooting sports and practice throughout the winter.
