## Winter Military Rifle Match Held

Our first winter Military Rifle match for 2016 was held on Saturday Jan. 16th at the 100-yard rifle range with 8 shooters. Firearms represented included an M1A, M14, (5) AR-15's and an 1871 Dutch Beaumont. Winner of the open sight division was Chris Leiti with a score of 89 out of 100, followed by Dave Vandermark with an 85 and Bob Webb with an 84. In the scope division, the winner was Mark Smokowicz with a score of 98 followed by Vic Thomas with a 94. Additional competitors were Rob Ashley, Allie Thomas, and Gerry Marken. Thanks to Dave Vandermark and Gerry Marken for the help assisting with the match.

Our next Winter Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, Feb 20th and is open to TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle, foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope.

The winter matches are conducted from the bench rest and course of fire is 10 rounds sightin over a period of 10 minutes followed by 10 rounds for score over a period of 20 minutes. Highest score wins (tightest grouping in case of a tie). Bring 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, hearing protection, registration fee and appropriate warm clothing. A spotting scope is useful, and you may also bring rests or other positioning gear. Some blocks and sand bags are available.
