October President's Column


How do you earn volunteer hours and keep up-to-date on TCSL events? Come to the TCSL Board and TCSL Membership meetings. The next meetings are on October 19, 2017 with hamburger night starting at 5 pm. You can enjoy fellowship with members while eating your hamburger.

So, what did you miss at the September meetings? The board approved allowing members ONLY to draw from the holsters after the member has passed an evaluation. The Safety Committee is working out the details on the evaluation, training, etc. New TCSL bylaws were passed/approved.

Larry Darling reported on the new link on our web page in the members' only section that allows TCSL member to buy shirts, key chains, etc. with the TCSL logo on it. TCSL does not need to maintain any inventory and the company providing the goods takes the orders on an as needed basis with the goods being delivered to TCSL each month. 
For the second month in a row, nine new members were read in and approved as members. New discussions on covering the creek occurred and it appears as if potentially a less expensive option has been developed. Volunteers will be needed to tear the old cover off and install the new one but the project looks less daunting now.

Do you know what happened on October 26, 1881 around 3 pm in Tombstone Arizona? The famous "Gunfight at the O.K. Corral" occurred. Marshal Virgil Earp, Special Policeman Morgan Earp, Special Policeman Wyatt Earp and temporary policeman Doc Holliday on one side took on several members of the "Cowboys", an organized group of outlaws. There was a feud that had been brewing before the shootout between the Cowboys and the Earp clan.



History records show it was a very brief shootout (e.g., thirty seconds) and it did not settle the feud. Virgil Earp was shot and maimed on December 28, 1881 and Morgan Earp killed on March 18, 1882 by what were believed to be Cowboy members. Wyatt Earp didn't let matters rest and he shot Frank Stilwell, a member of the Cowboy clan that he suspected had shot Virgil and Morgan.

After the "Gunfight at the O.K. Corral", which really occurred six doors west of the O.K. Corral, the Earp's and Doc Holliday faced murder charges which were dropped several weeks later after a thirty day preliminary hearing and then by a grand jury.

Military Rifle Match 2017

A Military Rifle Match was held on Saturday September 16^{th} on the 100-yd rifle range. Rifles represented included AR-15s, M1 Garands, and a Swiss K-31.

Results of the match: 1st Place with a score of 367 out of 400 was David Harris, 2nd place went to Gerry Marken with a score of 330 and in 3rd place was Paul Siska with a score of 292. In the optics division the winner was Jim Szocik with a score of 280.

The next and final Military Rifle Match for 2017 will be held on Saturday October 21st, 2017. (Bench rest shoots will begin in January, watch here for further notice.) Registration begins at 9:00 am and the match starts at 10:00 am. The match is open to members \$10 and guests \$15. To compete all you need is a military style rifle (non-automatic), domestic or foreign, vintage or modern, sporterized or customized, scoped or iron sights. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful. The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone positon for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score: (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing un-supported position. For the Slow fire portion, single fed rounds are fired within 10 minutes, while Rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. New Brass Collection Bins at Tri-County

Did you know that Tri-County is now selling range brass? Since last fall, range brass has been collected, cleaned, bagged, and sold to reloaders on a trial basis. It takes a lot more work than taking it to the scrap yard, but we are realizing a lot more from the sale of it by doing this. However, to make this operation work, the club needs your help! Your part is simple enough. If you don't want to keep your own brass after shooting, simply pick it up and drop it in one of the new collection bins. Look for an olive green box at each of the ranges and bays (all except action bay 4).

Rimfire brass goes in the bins as well - it still gets sold as scrap, and we'll sort it. Steel and aluminum cases can go into the trash, although if you put them in the bin, that's OK too (the important part is that they get picked up off the range). If you are not sure if your brass is nickel plated or aluminum or steel, go ahead and put it in the bins and we'll figure it out at sorting. Please don't throw away nickel plated brass! Having shooters pick up their brass and put it in the bins will make this operation much easier, and now that there is a bin at each range, it will be easier to do. So far we have sold enough brass to equate to signing up about 10 new members. The more brass we have, and the more variety of brass, the more we will sell. If you have brass laying around your bench at home that you no longer need, please bring it in and donate it! The only thing we ask is that if the brass is primed or obviously scrap, please bag it in a Ziploc bag to keep it together - it will be easier to spot that way at sorting (we have to deprime it to ship it). Please help out by putting these bins to use - the club will benefit from the sales, and our ranges will look clean and neat for our members and guests. And if you are in need of some brass to keep you shooting, you can contact Dave Vandermark at rifle@tcsl.org to see if we have what you need.
