Please make sure your requests for an absentee ballot are received on or before January 10, 2018 so there is no question in terms of whether or not the request was timely and to allow them adequate time to process your request. Elections will be held Thursday February 15, 2018 and Jerry Zapolnik who is also serving on the Election Committee will join Bill and Mike at the clubhouse on February 15, 2018 to monitor the elections, tally the results, etc.

Don't forget we are in a new year in terms of volunteer hours. Please make sure when you do volunteer that you fill out the book by the drinking fountain. Put the date, your start and stop time, your name, your membership number and a brief statement of what you did. If you are volunteering on a committee make sure the chair of the committee has your name, membership number and start /stop time. Also, make sure the committee chair turns the hours into the membership secretary. You can go to the members' only page on the TCSL webpage www.tcsl.org to check your hours. It is easier to monitor your hours throughout the year then it is to try and determine if you were given credit for all of your volunteer hours when you receive your renewal application next year. Also remember 25 volunteer hours gets \$25 off next year's annual range pass, 50 hours gets \$50 off and 75 hours gets you a free annual range pass. In reviewing the hours worked by members last year it is interesting to note that it is not often that a member gets 75 hours and then stops volunteering. By the time you have 75 volunteer hours you won't want to stop since you will have connected with a lot of members and a lot of projects, so you will keep volunteering since you enjoy it. Remember associate hours count towards their spouse's obligation.

INCREASE IN MEMBERSHIP DUES / RANGE FEES

TCSL membership dues have not been increased in years and in large part this has been due to the large number of volunteer hours that members work each year. Despite all of the volunteer hours, after looking into membership dues at other ranges/clubs, as well as the current costs to run TCSL, the Finance Committee recommended an increase in dues and the Board approved their recommendation.

Effective January 1, 2018 dues and range fees will be as set out below:

General Membership \$150

Young Adult \$75

Associate \$35

Junior \$30

Senior \$75

Past President \$25

Range Fees

Currently if you want to shoot at two ranges on the same day you pay two range fees (one for each range). Now members pay \$3 per range and non-members \$5 per range. Effective January 1, 2018 there will be one range fee per day which will allow you to shoot at more than one range. Starting January 1, 2018 members will pay \$5 per day for range fees and non-members will pay \$8 per day for range fees.

Cover the Creek Project

Cover the Creek: As many of you know, the wooden cover over Koch-Warner Drain (by the trap fields) is in serious need of repair. This is an environmental issue we face and needs to be addressed. After discussion, quotes, reviews, and further discussion, we now have a plan. Announcing the "Cover the Creek Project." This project needs to be successful, and 100% membership support will make that happen. Only with your help will we be able to keep our commitment to the stewardship of the creek running through our property. A new, economical design has been approved and includes a steel-construction roof and new supports. We have a total of 50 sections to be replaced, and the cost of materials for each section is estimated at \$160. We will need to clear brush and construct and install the new ones. To cover all of this, we've set a fundraising goal of \$10,000 for the entire project.

Should the project cost less than that, any excess funds will be deposited to our building fund.

How can you help? Here are just a few ways:

- 1.Make a financial contribution. \$50 per member/household would put us over our \$10,000 goal. We can't stress enough the importance of completing this project. Of course, we encourage you to donate more. Please see below for the options.
