If it's been a while since you've visited our Archery Range, I encourage you to visit it again, fling some arrows, refresh your skills, and remember how much fun it can be! Hunter Education and Safety

All first-time hunters born on or after January 1, 1960, are required to take and pass a hunter safety course. You will not be able to purchase a base license (other than an apprentice license) unless you can prove successful completion of a hunter safety course.

Hunter education courses teach new hunters responsibility, ethics, firearm safety, wildlife conservation and identification, game care, survival, and first aid. Courses are offered year-round throughout the state, though the majority occur in the spring (April and May) and in fall (August, September, and October). The typical hunter education course consists of two to five sessions with a total class time of 10-12 hours.

Get your hunter safety certificate in a classroom-based course (plus field day class): Traditional classroom hunter education classes are typically held in outdoor clubs, schools, police stations, and camps. A workbook home study alternative may be available in your area, but you must also register for a field day class BEFORE taking the home study course. Search for a class in your area and arrange your field day with the instructor. The instructor will let you know if the workbook home study is available. The cost of the course could be up to \$10.00 to cover field supplies. The instructor will tell you the cost when you register for the course.

Visit the DNR's Recreational Safety Education Class Database and select the class type (Hunter) and county in the drop-down lists.

Get your hunter safety certificate online (plus field day class):

You may also choose to take the class online. After taking an online course, you are required to attend the skills/field day portion of a regular class and take the student examination in order to receive your hunter safety certificate. You will need to pre-register for the skills/field portion of a regular class BEFORE taking the online course. Upon passing the online course, you will be eligible to complete the skills/field portion and take the written examination without attending a classroom course. There are fees associated with the online course and field day portion of the training. The following are approved online courses:

Our next Military Rifle Match (a Bench Match) will be held on Saturday, January 19, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am, and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military-style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope. You will need 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, and ear protection. Spotting scopes are helpful.

The course of fire for the event will be: ten (10) rounds of slow fire from the bench for sight-in within 10 minutes. For score; ten (10) rounds slow fire from the bench within 10 minutes. For the slow fire, single fed rounds are fired within 10 minutes.

Membership Report

December brings to an end the volunteer hours accumulation for 2018. The normal calendar year for hours is December 1 through November 30; but this year, the Board of Directors voted to allow the cutoff to be extended to December 8, to enable members to use Cover the Creek project hours toward their 2018 total. (Volunteers will have the option to credit their work hours for that day to either 2018 or 2019.)

Since taking over as Membership Secretary, I have changed the way hours are recorded. In the past, hours were just added to a member's total, with no record of the activity or task. I am now maintaining a table of hours that includes the member card number, the activity, the task, the date, and the hours. We were five months into the year when I started, so there is detail for only May through December. The hours before May are included in the table, but only as a running total for each member.

Here are some examples of some statistics that can be selected:

Total hours to date: 11,624.00*
TCSL IDPA Tier 2 Challenge: 1,269.25
Women On Target: 1,137.00
Kids On Range Day: 422.75
Friday Steak Fry: 291.50
Grounds Work: 172.25

318 members have either completed their volunteer-hour requirement or are over 65 and not obligated to volunteer.

Another function of this record-keeping is to help determine the members who are eligible for credit toward a 2019 range pass. As you know, a member who volunteers 25 hours will receive \$25 off their optional 2019 range pass, 50 hours will give them \$50 off, and 75+ hours will earn them a free range pass. There are currently 37 members who are eligible for a free range pass, 19 are eligible for \$50 off, and 33 are eligible for \$25 off.

In the last 4 months we have added 14 new members and there are 6 pending that need to attend the orientation session.


