Archery Range & Program Survey Says:

You may recall from our December newsletter that the Archery Range & Program Chair announced that a survey was scheduled for late 2018/early 2019. Well, the survey was delivered to 65 email in-boxes (everyone who indicated archery as an interest on their membership application), and the results are in.

First—THANK YOU to the members who clicked on the link to submit their answers. Your feedback will help guide our priorities for 2019.

Based on their answers, 54% of survey respondents consider themselves archery hunters and use the range to hone their hunting skills. None were competition archers, and the remainder use the archery range for recreation and enjoyment. Most (47%) use a compound bow, followed by crossbow (32%), recurve (16%), and longbow (5%). If those numbers don't add up, that's because survey participants were permitted to indicate more than one category.

Top priorities recommended for action on the archery range include updating/replacing targets, considerations for targets that hold up to crossbow use, adding a bench or table to the range, and adding yardage markers. In terms of programming, several people are eager to see some beginner classes for kids and adults first, but also more advanced classes, and possibly some topic-specific instruction, like a seminar on archery equipment.

I was pleased to receive a short list of individuals who tentatively agreed to serve as a range-instructor and/or safety officer for 2019 educational programming, but understandably, nearly all of them also indicated needing some training or mentoring prior to agreeing to help run courses. One person also agreed to serve on the archery committee, and I'm really grateful for that!

Based on the survey results, my top priority for the range itself is the targets. We'll be evaluating the current targets for repair/replace decisions, and I will advocate that any new targets we get on the range will be crossbow compatible. My top priority in terms of educational programming will be to

offer "training for the trainers" in the upcoming months. I will work with TCSL leadership to determine the cost, scope and location of this training, but in order to run beginner programs for kids or adults, we'll need several people as instructors or safety officers, so that's where we will begin.

If you have an interest in helping with the archery range or archery educational programming, please reach out to me and let me know! Meanwhile, keep your broad heads sharp and your skills even sharper!

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, February 16, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am, and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope.

The winter matches are conducted from the bench rest, and course of fire is 10 rounds sightin over a period of 5 minutes followed by 10 rounds for score over a period of 10 minutes. Highest score wins. Bring 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, hearing protection, registration fee and appropriate warm clothing. A spotting scope is useful, and you may also bring rests or other positioning gear. Some blocks and sand bags are available.

Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle.
