Larry's 1903 Springfield was a Civilian-issued target rifle made by the U.S. Government and sold to the public to help promote target shooting after WWI. It was truly beautiful, and almost one of a kind. See what you miss by not coming to the Military Match?

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, March 16, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am, and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope.

The winter matches are conducted from the bench rest, and course of fire is 10 rounds sight-in over a period of 5 minutes followed by 10 rounds for score over a period of 10 minutes. Highest score wins. Bring 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, hearing protection, registration fee and appropriate warm clothing. A spotting scope is useful, and you may also bring rests or other positioning gear. Some blocks and sand bags are available.

Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, though they are surely welcome; you only need to own a military-style rifle.
