#### **Presidents Column**

Here is a recap of this year's Michigan United Conservation Clubs Convention. This year it was the 82nd Annual. It was June 21-23. TCSL members Jim Pryce & Kris Matthew were our club delegates. Picture below shows Jim in the front row & Kris sitting behind him.

On Saturday morning we had a Moments of Memory to remember and read the names of Sportspersons who have passed away since last June's convention. The people remembered as Tri-County people we lost were, Howard Bauer, Roger Sacks, Don Feldkamp, Marvin Pashukewich, Gerald Zapolink, Clifford Olson, & Gerald Schmid. Grant Eternal Rest to them O Lord.

On Sunday morning Jim Pryce opened the meeting by leading everyone in the invocation. He was honored to be chosen to do so for the second year in a row. Next year the convention will be in Sault Ste Marie.

About 150 sportsmen, women and conservationists came together over that weekend to debate conservation issues facing the state and its wildlife at Michigan United Conservation Clubs' (MUCC) Annual Convention.

MUCC's 82nd Annual Convention kicked off with an On the Ground project in the Backus Creek State Game Area and culminated on Saturday afternoon with the organization's grassroots process on full display at the Lakeside Resort and Conference Center in Houghton Lake.

In total, 22 member-drafted resolutions were brought to the floor for deliberation. Of those, 16 passed through the body and were adopted as MUCC policy, five were voted down and one was withdrawn.

Some passed resolutions aim to broaden and sanction trap shooting as a high school sport throughout Michigan, call for research and solutions on PFAs issues as they directly relate to fish and wildlife, expand the hours that you are allowed to use artificial lights when deer hunting and create a set of criteria for Natural Resources Commission (NRC) appointments.

As well as two resolutions directly pertaining to Sportsmen's Clubs:

SPORT SHOOTING RANGES PROTECTION MODERNIZATION ACT
SPORTSMEN'S CLUB/SHOOTING CLUB FIREARMS OWNERSHIP

#### Get Ready, Company is Coming!

Shooter, make ready! TCSL is hosting the second annual IDPA Sportsmen's Challenge match September 27-29th. Last year we attracted 140 participants from across the country, Canada, and two shooters from Finland. We expect the same numbers or better this year. While we have a local match the 4th Saturday of each month, the Sportsmen's Challenge is classified as a Tier Two match sanctioned by IDPA National headquarters. The match is promoted through IDPA in Michigan and also on the National IDPA website to invite shooters to participate. Our monthly match features five stages of shooting scenarios, but a Tier 2 match has eight stages that are creative and challenging courses of fire designed by our members. The stage designs are then critically reviewed by IDPA regional and our state coordinator, Mike Barrera.

Last year was our first Tier 2 event. While most of the folks attending had been here before, many had not, and their experience was beyond their expectations. Comments from shooters were that the courses of fire were "deceivingly difficult " but fun. The people they encountered were friendly, professional (SOs), and helpful. But, the one thing TCSL has that most clubs don't, is our accommodations. The food, bar, and clubhouse facility were something that not many clubs have available. This is a huge asset in hosting these visitors!

IDPA events bring in good revenues for our club from participants fees. This year, thanks to the efforts of Ed White, we have to date 27 corporate sponsors who have contributed over \$9,000 in shooter prizes. Special thanks to those folks on the front lines who are planning and organizing this event: Earl Austin, Steve Nesmith, Martin Clifford, Jim Walter, Don Hasselbach, and Mike Cowhy—to name just fa ew of the 25 to 30 helpers.

We need help during these events, so if you desire work hours, please sign up! You will never work so hard, and have fun doing so.

At next year's event we plan on having 10 courses of fire with the updating of our Turkey Ranges. These range updates are funded by special events events like this. See you in September!

#### First Lever-Action Match Held

Our Inaugural Lever Action Match was held on Saturday August  $3^{rd}$  at the 100-yard rifle range with 3 shooters.

Results of the match:

The match proved more difficult that it appeared, and there were some interesting pieces to the scoring. First, shooters using scoped rifles were immediately docked 30 points. The first round consisted of 10 shots fired standing, unsupported at 50 yards. Each shooter started with 5 rounds in their magazine tube, and 5 rounds sitting on a bench to their side. When given the command to fire, each shooter had to chamber and shoot their first five rounds, then load 5 more rounds and complete the course of fire. The time limit for this round was 80 seconds. However, any shooter that completed the round in under 70 seconds received 1 bonus point for every 2 seconds under 70 seconds for the round.

The second round consisted of 10 rounds single fed off of a bench at 100 yards. So there were a possible 200 points, and only one shooter qualified for bonus points. The different range distances proved to be more challenging than most thought. Many who were interested in participating in the shoot were not able to the day of the match. The shooters that did said they had a good time, so we will hold another lever match in the future, at least one annually.

#### **Bowling Pin Shoots**



Pin shooting is a fun, but challenging event. We welcome the skilled shooter, as well as, the novice shooter to participate. We guarantee you will enjoy yourself, while enhancing your shooting skills. Members are encouraged to bring friends/family along with them. Non-members are welcome.

PCC & .22 Rifle Bowling Pin Shoot PCC (pistol caliber carbine)

The cost for each relay (20 pins = 5 pins x 4 tables) is \$5.00

The shooter stands **20 yards** away from a structure, with 6 bowling pins on it. A safety officer, with a timer, will give the command to commence firing, at which time the shooter will begin shooting until all 5 pins are knocked down. The time it takes to knock 5 pins down is recorded. The average time of the shooters best 3 tables will determine his/her score. Bragging rights are determined by the lowest shooter's score.

If you don't own a PCC or .22 rifle and would like to participate, there are several members on site who are willing to loan you their .22 Rifle for this event.

Handgun Bowling Pin Shoot (PCC & .22 Rifle also welcome) and Handgun 4x4 Steel Plate Challenge Sundays: Apr 28, May 19, Jun 9, Jul 21, Aug 18, Sep 15

11:30 AM until 5:00 PM Shooting starts at 12:00 noon.

The cost for each relay (20 pins = 5 pins x 4 tables) is \$5.00.

The shooter stands **25 feet** away from a structure, with 5 bowling pins on it. A safety officer with a timer will give the command to commence firing, at which time the shooter will begin shooting until all 5 pins are knocked down. The time it takes to knock 5 pins down is recorded. The average time of the shooters best 3 tables will determine his/her score. Bragging rights are determined by the lowest shooter's score (time).

In the 4X4 Steel Plate Challenge, shooters will get two chances to knock down 4 steel plates, using only 4 rounds of ammo in their handgun. Speed and accuracy will determine the winner. Shooter with the fastest time of the day wins a cash prize. The cost to try the 4X4 Challenge is \$4.00.


If you don't own a handgun, PCC or .22 rifle and would like to participate, there are several members on site who are willing to loan you their .22 handgun or rifle for this event.





### **Running Deer Shoot**



The "HANDGUN SHOOT" (Running Deer Shoot) is structured much the same as a good old Turkey Shoot as 10 individuals buy into a relay. All 10 take there turn shooting at the running deer. After each individual shoots their score is totaled and radioed up to the officials table. The highest score of the re wins a prize.

The shooter is positioned 25 yards away from a hanging deer silhouette. The deer silhouette is positioned at the right side of the gallery. Round count and order may change from relay to relay. Our usual starting sequence is 2 shots at the deer standing still and 2 shots while the deer is running. Once the final standing shoot is fired the deer will begin to move across the gallery from right to left.

This event is open to the public. This event is open to Handguns, 22 Rifles and PCC's (Pistol Caliber Carbines). Pistols will compete against pistols. .22 Rifles and PPC's will compete among them self. All type sights or optics are allowed.
