President's Column

In a year when everything seems out of sorts, we are rapidly approaching the end of summer 2020. Hopefully, you and your family are staying safe and healthy. Perhaps you have been able to start new summer traditions based on the changes to everyday life amid COVID-19 and more than 145 Executive Orders. Enjoy the rest of summer before the leaves start turning colors, which means snow is approaching.

Originally, I had scheduled Meet & Greet sessions on a few Saturdays every four to six weeks when Officers and Board Members who were available would be at the TCSL Clubhouse to talk to members. The purpose was to socialize, network, and get ideas for future activities at TCSL. Unfortunately, all of the Meet & Greet meetings were cancelled due to COVID-19. Keep your eyes on the TCSL on-line calendar, since I will be re-instating the meetings as soon as possible.

The TCSL Board meeting in August 2020 will be a Zoom meeting in a continuing effort to keep everyone healthy, follow current Executive Orders, practice social distancing, etc. Pursuant to our bylaws, there will be NO August membership meeting. In September, we will have both a TCSL Board meeting and also a TCSL Membership meeting. I am going to try and have both these September meetings in person; however, a lot will depend on the current Executive Orders that are in place in September. So stay tuned for an update on how the September meetings will be conducted.

I would like to emphasize the hours the ranges are open. The ranges are open on Monday through Saturday from 10am until dusk or 8pm, whichever comes FIRST. On Sunday the ranges are open from 12pm until dusk or 8pm, whichever comes FIRST. Lately, there have been a few occasions of people shooting before 12pm on Sunday or after 8pm during the week. These times, both the startup and end times, as well as the different times on Sunday, have been in place for a long time and, in part, were set so our neighbors could enjoy their evenings or their mornings without shooting in the background. If you are at TCSL and you hear someone violating these restrictions, please nicely inform them of our rules. Keep in mind, the trap range remains closed.

At the August TCSL Board meeting a report will be provided based upon the motion set out below which the TCSL Board approved at the June meeting.

That the environmental task force and various committees review the November 2002 NRA Range Evaluation Report, the most current version of the USEPA's publication, *Best Management Practices for Lead at Outdoor Shooting Ranges*, and the 2007 TCSL Environmental Stewardship Plan/MUCC Agreement and report to the board by the August 2020 board meeting what, if any, requirements, recommendations, or suggestions in those documents need to be implemented along with a proposed 2020-2021 implementation schedule based priority.

Also at the June 2020 TCSL Board meeting, the following motion was passed:

That because the creek on the trap range is no longer covered and Section 3.2.2 of the 2007 TCSL Environmental Stewardship Plan/MUCC Agreement requires the trap range to be closed until effective protection of the waterway is restored, the trap committee should develop and present a proposal for approval to the appropriate committees and the board to allow temporary trap shooting elsewhere on TCSL property, if possible, until a permanent trap shooting option is developed and approved.

At the July TCSL Board meeting the Trap Committee did not have any proposals to present to the Board to allow temporary trap shooting elsewhere on the TCSL property, if possible, until a permanent trap shooting option is developed and approved. Information had also not been received in terms of the costs/potential income from lead reclamation on the trap range (or the pistol and rifle ranges) at the time of the July TCSL Board meeting. We now have received information from one vendor on reclaiming lead at the rifle and pistol ranges; however, a site visit is required to get information on the trap range.

Based upon COVID-19 concerns and Executive Orders, TCSL hall rentals have not occurred over the last few months. Income from classes is up and new ideas (e.g., Chicken Dinner Fundraiser) are being attempted to generate income for TCSL. Still, at the end of the day, the lost income from hall rental is a significant loss of income for TCSL. The Booster Club was put in place, in part, to help replace the loss of income from hall rental. Members have made donations to TCSL (Thank you to everyone who donated funds, especially during these times.). However, we're looking at approximately a \$10,000 expense to have the back stops on all of the pistol ranges and two of the rifle ranges fixed. So that these backstops can be repaired before the ground freezes and ranges are closed for the second year in a row, please make any donation you can to the TCSL Booster Club. Every donation will help fund the project. The goal is to get the backstops repaired in early fall so all of the ranges can remain open during the winter.

Keep monitoring the on-line TCSL calendar for changes in schedules, new events, etc. This year, more than in recent years, the calendar is constantly changing each week. For example, some of our classes have been full, so additional classes have been added to handle the over-flow. Reach out to Brian Craig (734-637-8000) if you would like to see a different class added. NRA Basic Rifle course has been added as a distance-learning class with the range time on the rifle ranges. (See August 29 and 30 on the on-line calendar.)

Natural Resources Commission Approves 2020 Deer Hunting Regulations

The [Michigan Natural Resources Commission](#) has just approved a new package of deer regulations at their regular monthly meeting, which was conducted in an online and conference call format due to COVID-19 public health and safety concerns. Michigan Department of Natural Resources deer program experts say the regulations, which will be in effect for the 2020 deer hunting season, will provide additional opportunities and cost-savings for hunters and will offer flexibility in how hunters pursue deer. The DNR uses existing and projected data to gauge the impact of proposed regulations. The data shows that the projected changes will not have a significant negative effect on the deer herd or the quality of deer hunting. "These recommendations are aimed at making it easier for hunters of all ages and experience levels to enjoy a Michigan outdoor tradition, while at the same time facing the present and future challenges of managing the state's abundant deer population," said Chad Stewart, the DNR's deer, elk, and moose program leader.

Approved deer regulations for 2020 include:

Statewide. Liberty and Independence hunt qualifications now include deaf people. Mentored youths (age 9 and younger), junior license holders (age 10-16), and apprentice license holders are exempt from antler point restrictions in all seasons, in all deer management units (DMUs) and under all licenses, which include both the regular and restricted tags on the deer combo license. The statewide limit for private-land antlerless license purchase is 10 per hunter. This limit offers maximum opportunity for those who wish to manage abundant deer on their property. Hunters with disabilities may use single-bite and multibite baits during the Liberty and Independence hunts. Hunters participating in the Liberty and Independence hunts may begin baiting five days before both hunts.

Upper Peninsula. Upper Peninsula archers in select DMUs may pursue antlerless deer with their deer/deer combo license. The following DMUs continue to be closed to antlerless harvest during the archery seasons: 027, 031, 036, 042, 066, 127 and 131. Additional DMUs may be open or closed based on the snowfall totals from the prior winter, pending DNR analysis. Please see the 2020 Hunting Digest for complete regulations when it becomes available in August. Antler point restrictions have been removed on the deer license in parts of DMU 122, including areas outside the core chronic wasting disease surveillance area.

Lower Peninsula. In addition to the archery season, antlerless deer may be taken on the deer/deer combo license during the firearm and muzzleloader seasons in all Lower Peninsula DMUs. Early and late antlerless seasons will be open in all Lower Peninsula mainland DMUs. Antlerless deer may be taken on a deer/deer combo license during both the early and late antlerless seasons in the Lower Peninsula. Antlerless quotas will change in select DMUs. The muzzleloader season in the southern Lower Peninsula will be shortened to 10 days and the late antlerless firearm season will begin the Monday after the muzzleloader season concludes in the Lower Peninsula. Muzzleloaders can be used on public lands in Zone 3 during the late antlerless firearm season to take any deer with a valid tag. All legal firearms may be used during the muzzleloader season in the southern Lower Peninsula. Carcass movement restrictions will be scaled to areas most affected by chronic wasting disease. This aligns movement restrictions to areas with the highest risk of CWD is being observed. The expanded archery season through January 31 will continue for one more year in Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties. It previously expired January 31, 2020. The 2020 Hunting Digest will have further information regarding these regulations. The digest is in the process of being finalized now that regulations are set. Watch for the current digest in August at Michigan.gov/DNRRDigests.

The New "NRA CCW" Course

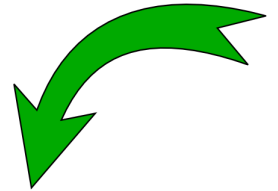
Until this year, in order to get your concealed pistol license, the state of Michigan require that you take a course that covered the use of deadly force and fire at least shoot 30 rounds of ammo. This course had to be recognized as a national organization that provide at the training that would meet or exceed these states requirements. In Michigan, the NRA's "Personal Protection in the Home" met that requirement and that class was taught so that law bidding citizens could apply for their concealed pistol license. The problem with this course is you were never shown how to concealed carry or draw from a holster or deal with a fire fight. It is exactly as the title suggests, protection inside the home. If you wanted to carry outside the home the NRA has adjusted another class called "Personal Protection Outside the Home". Unfortunately, the average citizen did not want to sit through a two day course firing 250 rounds.

Finally! The NRA has introduced a new course called the "NRA CCW" course. This course takes the best of many courses that the NRA offers and now truly has prepared people for concealed carry outside of the home. This course deals with many different types of Carry modes, emergency or slide lock reloads or magazine changes versus combat reloads magazine changes. This is the first course that really deals with how to survive on the street in a fire fight, in a one day course. It deals with unjamming your firearm under pressure and re-engage in your threats until they are no longer a threat.

Even if you already have your Concealed Pistol License, this is a great course to take and more importantly, it is great training to have and to continue to train with because this is one test in life that effects everyone we love.

This course fills up fast, so sign up early from the calendar. The next two TCSL classes are Saturday, August 8, or Sunday, August 23. Contact [TCSL Education](#) to have a link sent to you.

New Rifle Match Being Help Saturday, August 29

On **August 29** we will be having a new rifle match at TCSL. We're calling it the "**Cavalry Match**," as it kind of leans toward shooting that you might have done if you were a cavalry trooper in the late 1800s. It will take place on the 25-, 50-, and 100-yard rifle ranges; and here are the firearm requirements:

- 1) A centerfire, iron-sighted pistol of any type (semi-auto, revolver, or single shot), along with at least 10 rounds of ammunition for the pistol. No red dots or optics of any kind.
- 2) A centerfire rifle with iron sights and a **barrel of 20 inches long or less (a carbine)**. It can be of any type (semi-auto, bolt, lever, pump, single shot, etc.), but must be capable of being easily single loaded and fired. You will need at least 30 rounds of ammunition for the rifle. No red dots or optics of any kind.

Match fees will be \$10 for members, \$15 for guests. Here is the course of fire:

Round 1 – Firing from the Horse

The course of fire will start on the 50-yard range with 10 rounds fired for score. The shooter will be seated on a stool and

fire unsupported (no bench, no slings). The first five rounds will be fired with the shooter facing the target (shoulders square to the target, legs on either side of stool). The stool will be turned 90 degrees, and the shooter will fire 5 rounds across their body (shoulders in line with target, legs on either side of stool). And all firing will be done single-loaded, with ammunition in a pouch on your belt (we provide the pouch). And there is a time limit: 40 seconds for each 5-shot group. Any shots not taken, or taken after the time limit, will not count.

Round 2 – Dismounted, Kneeling

10 shots with a rifle at 50 yards from the kneeling position, unsupported, single loaded, in 80 seconds. Ammo will again be held in a pouch on the shooter's belt. Any shots not taken, or taken after the time limit, will not count.

Round 3 – Prone, Behind your Horse

10 shots fired lying down with a rifle at 100 yards, single loaded, using a rounded rest to simulate shooting from behind a downed horse. 10 shots in 80 seconds, with ammo held in a belt pouch. Any shots not taken, or taken after the time limit, will not count.

Round 4 – Pistol as a Last Resort

10 shots standing, one-handed from 25 yards. Pistol will start unloaded and on a bench next to the shooter. If a revolver is used, no speed loaders are allowed. If an automatic, the magazine must be empty at the start and on the bench, and only one magazine may be used. Ammo will be stored in a belt pouch. At start, the shooter will load the pistol (or magazine) with 5 rounds and shoot the target at 25 yards, then reload 5 more rounds and fire on the same target. If an autoloader is used, the same magazine must be loaded twice with 5 rounds each time (this will make it more even between revolvers and autoloaders regarding speed). All 10 shots must be taken within 80 seconds. Any shots not taken, or taken after the time limit, will not count.

Simple, right? Probably not. Come on out on August 29 and shoot, or just come watch. **Remember: no scopes or other optics are allowed (and no spotting scopes either), and no rimfire firearms.** There will be no sight-in shots, so get to the club and practice ahead of the match. Winner Winner Chicken Dinner

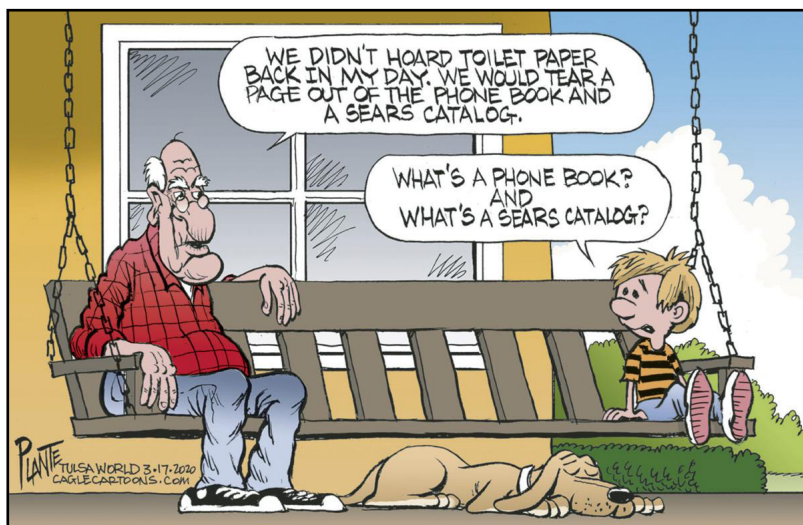

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, August 15th, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone position for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing unsupported position. For the Slow fire portion single fed rounds are fired within 8 minutes, while rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match. **Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle.** For further information or questions contact Dave Vandermark at rifle@TCSL.org.
