If you haven't been out to the ranges in the last month, take a break from your schedule and go inspect the rifle ranges and pistol ranges. The backstops on the ranges have all been built back up. In addition, by the archery ranges you can see the start of two new pistol ranges. The new pistol ranges are not yet ready to be used, but you will see the footprint of the new ranges. Hopefully, with the addition of some more dirt, sand, etc. we will be able to open up the new ranges in the summer of 2021.

We have requested bids from contractors to put a "shot curtain/ screen" up on the trap range(s). Once the bids are in, the Finance Committee will review the bids, and then the board will decide how to proceed. The goal is to get the trap ranges up and running as soon as possible. The financial support of members during this year has kept TCSL in a stable financial position, which has provided the funds to work on the backstops and, hopefully, get a "shot curtain/screen" up on the trap range(s).

A lot of members have stepped up to help with activities at TCSL, which has helped bring in funds this year from a wide variety of activities. The recent "Rummage Sale" brought in more than \$1,300. IDPA activities over the year have netted a lot of money for TCSL. The TCSL Booster Club and donations from members who have been paying their dues early have helped. Takeout Chicken Dinner, dance lessons, Takeout Breakfast, classes, Turkey Shoots, Pin Shoots, Military Rifle, the sale of brass, etc. have all helped replace the loss of income from hall rental.

The February 2021 TCSL elections are approaching. The current officers have all announced they are running for re-election. If you are on the TCSL Board of Directors and you want to run for an officer position, then at the December 2020 TCSL Board meeting you will need to announce that you are stepping down from the Board to run for an officer position. 2020 IDPA Challenge

The 2020 Tri-County Sportsmen Challenge is in the books. Another great event that was successful because of the hard work of the members of Tri-County. In all the positive feedback we got from the participants, the No. 1 item that came up was our STAFF/SAFETY OFFICERS. No. 2 was about FACILITIES and FLOW of the event. So, before the shooters even took a shot, they were impressed. This doesn't happen by chance. During the month of September 2020, we had more than 1000 volunteer work



hours devoted to this event. But the planning and work started in September of 2019. Total hours (if anyone kept track) would exceed 2000 hours. Planning for 2021 Challenge, started Saturday morning while we prepared for our first paying customer. The final complements were on how well designed the COF (courses of fire) where and how challenging the match was. There wasn't a shooter who had a complaint. This event has established Tri-County as a premier IDPA club.

This year's event hosted 146 shooters, which was about the same as last year. Due to Covid we were limited to 100 people on the property, thus limiting us to 70 shooters a day. The Club took in close to \$12,000 and profited \$5000. Through the generosity of our sponsors, we were able to distribute \$14,000 worth of their products to the shooters—half of whom went home with items worth more than \$50. This always makes for happy shooters!

Next year's event will have some major changes. It will be a Tier 3 event, requiring more help. Two new bays will be added, which will allow us to have 180 paying shooters on Saturday and Sunday. With the larger number of range officer and staff, we could exceed 220 total shooters. With the increase in shooters and a higher entry fee, we could bring in an excess of \$20,000, with a projected profit of \$10,000 to \$12,000. This would be a welcome boost to our annual income. None of this will be possible without all the work of members and non-members. I hope that this success and exposure will lead the way for our club to reach a financial stability and a growth in membership. If you want to be a part of something big, hang out with a group of hardworking individuals, and have a great feeling of pride, come join us on the ranges. We can use help of all kinds: from builders, painters, SOs, fabricators, kitchen help, and more. It takes all kinds of members to pull this event off at the high level we have established. Come join us and feel the excitement and pride that I have come to enjoy, working with these GREAT people.

Range Safety

Carrying your firearm in a bag or case to the range:

- With unloaded firearm in bag/case, unloaded, with chamber flag in action, enter range and set bag on bench/barrel at firing line.
- Take out the firearm and lay down with muzzle facing down range. The firearm should be open to indicate it is unloaded.
- You may place ammunition next to the firearm. Place bag/case behind the shooter on the table/barrel. This allows all shooters a view of the firing line to see that all firearms have their actions open.
- To put the firearm away, bring bag/case back over to firing line bench/barrel and put unloaded firearm and ammunition into the bag/case. This keeps the firearms facing downrange at all times.
- Remember, Only 1 gun and 1ammo allowed on the bench at a time.

Carrying on your person entering the range:

• Open Carry is ONLY permitted on the Pistol and Action Ranges, north of the creek. Your firearm must be either concealed or in a carry case or bag anywhere else on club grounds.

- Your firearm must remain holstered at all times until facing downrange standing at the firing line.
- Remove the firearm from holster, unload, and place on the firing line bench/barrel while facing downrange. The firearm should be open to indicate it is unloaded.
- The firearm must not be re-holstered until the time you are ready to leave the range. The firearm is then loaded, re-holstered, and concealed again at that point.
- Drawing from a holster is only allowed on the Action Range during TCSL-sanctioned events, or when under direct, one-on-one TCSL or IDPA approved supervision by a Safety Officer or Range Officer, or on Action Range Bays 2, 3, and 4 if a TCSL member meets specific requirements.
- This routine is followed so that shooters are not un-holstering or unloading firearms anywhere but on the firing line facing downrange.

Our next 185 Yard Bench Match will be held on Saturday, **September 4th, 2021**, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 10 am and the match begins at noon. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with <u>ANY</u> rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope, as long as you can fire the 10 rounds in 10 minutes. You will need 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, and ear protection. Spotting scopes are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (10) rounds of slow fire from the bench for sight-in within 10 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire from the bench within 10 minutes. For the slow fire, single fed rounds are fired within 10 minutes. Shooters may elect to use their score from the sight-in stage, but in doing so would forfeit shooting the 2nd round.
