President's Column

Groundhog Day falls in the middle between winter solstice and spring equinox. The Celts celebrated it as Imbolc, and it represented the beginning of spring. Imbolc changed into Candlemas Day, which was a Christian celebration that held that a sunny day meant 40 more days of cold and snow until spring. In Germany, the day was only considered sunny if badgers and small animals saw their shadows. As Germans settled in Pennsylvania during the 18th and 19th century, the immigrants selected native groundhogs as the small animals that would be used to see if their shadows would be seen.

February 2, 1887, a newspaper editor, Clymer Freas, persuaded a group of businessmen and groundhog hunters, to form the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club and to go to Gobbler's Knob to see if the groundhog would see his shadow at the first formal Groundhog's Day. The ground hog saw his shadow, and Punxsutawney Phil was created. Years later the tradition continues, and statistics show accuracy of less than 50%. Whether the Groundhog does or doesn't see his shadow this year, it is clear that the days are getting longer and spring is around the corner.



Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, February 20th and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope.

The winter matches are conducted from the bench rest, and course of fire is 10 rounds sight-in over a period of 5 minutes followed by 10 rounds for score over a period of 10 minutes. Highest score wins. Bring 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, hearing protection, registration fee and appropriate warm clothing. A spotting scope is useful, and you may also bring rests or other positioning gear. Some blocks and sand bags are available.

Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle.

We also have a 100yd 22LR Bench match scheduled for Saturday, February 6. Bring your rifle and 50 rds of ammo. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests.
