President's Column

The COVID restrictions have been removed, and TCSL is now fully open. Please take some time to read this column, since there are a lot of updates being provided.

We would like to paint the structures (i.e., pistol house, rifle house, storage sheds, etc.) on the property prior to the September IDPA Tier III match so that everything looks better. To complete this project, we need the following:

1. Someone to be the project manager;
2. Volunteers to help paint; and
3. Volunteers to loan TCSL spray paint equipment.

Please email me (steve@reedlawgrouppc.com) if you are able to help. I would like to have the painting done by July 31 so that we can avoid the August heat. The TCSL Board has already approved some funds to buy paint.

Gregory Hart has agreed to be our new Kitchen Chair, and we also have a new Grounds Chair: Michael O'Leary. Please reach out to both Greg and Mike and offer to help them in their new positions. You can email each of them from the [TCSL web page](#).

I would like to thank Phil Cardon for his efforts as Ground' Committee Chair. Phil did an outstanding job during his tenure.

Steak Fries are now back, and our first one will be on Friday July 23. Stay tuned for email blasts providing more details as the event approaches. Breakfast at Tri-County will return on Sunday, October 3.

We are continuing to look into whether or not we can offer Axe Throwing at the club as well. Hopefully, we can get this issue resolved by early fall.

The Tier III IDPA match will be in September, so reach out to Earl Austin to help him with that event. This year's event should have a larger turnout than last year's, so extra volunteers will be needed. In the meantime, we are once again able to serve food at IDPA monthly matches.

The Board approved the sale of the majority of the clay targets in the storage building by the Trap Ranges. Earlier this year, the Board approved opening the Trap Ranges for steel shot only; however, there hasn't been any interest shown in shooting steel. Since we've found that we can't fit a Trap Range onto the south side of the property, we may end up permanently closing the Trap Ranges and selling the Trap machines.

Starting with the September 16 TCSL Board and Membership meetings, we will be meeting in person at the Clubhouse. In July and August, there are no membership meetings. The July and August Board meetings will be conducted by Zoom.

Saturday and Sunday, October 9 and 10, will once again be the NRA Range Safety Office and TCSL Range Safety Officer courses which

are provided free to TCSL Members. At the end of the weekend, each student will receive 16 volunteer hours; and upon successful completion of the course, their NRA RSO and TCSL RSO rating. Those members helping teach the course will also receive 16 volunteer hours. Normally the NRA RSO course is \$75-\$150; however, TCSL members get the course at no cost as a benefit of their membership. The only cost is that students taking the courses need to also take the AED/CPR training which is provided during the course and \$40 is paid directly to the instructor (i.e., TCSL does not receive any portion of the \$40).

On Saturday, July 17, at 10:30am, there will be another TCSL RSO Zoom meeting to discuss RSO issues. We continue to need TCSL RSOs to help monitor the ranges. Pick a day, and then email [Mark Smokowicz](#) so he can add you to the calendar. If there is already an RSO on the calendar, feel free to shadow him or her if needed and also to just have a greater RSO presence on the ranges. Even showing up for 4 hours would be helpful, and keep in mind that you get double the volunteer time for RSO efforts during this summer.

We had dirt moved into the new pistol ranges. However, we still need some additional dirt and to move the dirt around before those ranges will be fully open. One option that is being considered is to move dirt from the Trap Ranges to the new ranges.

The Board approved the purchase of 3'x4' signs to put on each range. The signs will identify the types of firearms and calibers that can and can't be shot of each range. I would ask each range chair (i.e., Pistol, Archery, Rifle), IDPA chairs, safety chair, and Ed White to review the signs with [Val Kabat](#) to make sure the text is accurate and consistent with the current TCSL rules. Hopefully we can get the new signs up by the end of July.

The Board also approved a \$100 donation to MUCC to help with their budget issues.

Since the ranges and facilities are fully open, spread the word that Hall Rental is now once again available. Whether it is a wedding reception, family reunion, business meeting, etc., steer your friends and relatives to TCSL. Anyone interested should contact [Mark Smokowicz](#) if they want to rent the clubhouse.

As things are returning to normal, please monitor your emails. We will need volunteers for Hall Rentals. We need Range Safety Officers. There is no time better than now to step up and help out at the club. The more you get involved, the more you will realize that, while we have great ranges, a great clubhouse, etc., our greatest assets are our members.

I hope to see more of you in person at the clubhouse or on the ranges!! Stay safe and healthy.



Third Military Rifle Match Held

Our third standard Military Rifle Match for 2021 was held on Saturday, June 26th, at the 100-yard rifle range with 4 shooters.

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, August 21st, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone position for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing unsupported position. For the Slow fire portion single fed rounds are fired within 8 minutes, while rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match. **Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle.** For further information or questions contact Dave Vandermark at rifle@TCSL.org.

The cost for each relay (20 pins = 5 pins x 4 tables) is \$5.



From Michigan DNR Law Enforcement Division - Recreational Safety

During the Covid pandemic, we had approximately 14,000 students complete the online portion of the hunter safety course and need a field day to complete their permanent hunter safety certificate. Since classes were allowed to resume in March, we have not been able to offer enough opportunities for those students to earn their certificates. On June 2, those 14,000 students were offered an alternate opportunity to earn their permanent hunter safety certificate through a virtual field day. They can also still attend an in-person field day if they choose. This opportunity is only available to those students who completed the online course between September 10, 2019, and June 1, 2021.

For those students wanting to take hunter safety after June 1, 2021, the normal requirements for hunter safety resume. This would be the online course or home study with an in-person field day or the full traditional course.

I hope the virtual field day is not the way the DNR is heading in the Hunter Education department in the future.

As always, there is a need for volunteers, time and dedication to the hunting heritage that we have here in Michigan.

If you or anybody you know is interested in becoming a volunteer DNR Hunter Safety instructor, please contact me, and I would be glad to get you started. I have found it to be a gratifying experience.

Why volunteers are necessary:

- There are not enough conservation officers to conduct training in every community in the state. Although conservation officers are active in the recreational safety programs, they generally do not have enough time to conduct entire training classes along with their many other duties.
- Volunteers provide skills or expertise otherwise not available within the agency. Examples of such skills include professional teaching experience, specialty safety training, and specialty outdoor recreation training.
- Volunteers are often well-established local citizens who can help create community interest in the course. They usually have extensive local contacts and are aware of community needs.
- Also, think about introducing someone new to hunting and shooting sports. It might be something they enjoy for a lifetime.
- And remember: Safety begins with you.



Rules of Firearms Safety



When using a firearm, be sure to follow the five primary safety rules. You can remember these rules by thinking S.M.A.R.T.:

Safe Direction: Keep your firearm pointed in a safe direction at all times.

Make Sure: Positively identify your target.

Always Check: Know what's beyond your target before shooting.

Respect Firearms: Treat all firearms as if they are loaded.

Trigger Caution: Don't touch the trigger until you're ready to shoot.

Here are additional firearm safety rules that you should know:

- Check your barrel and ammunition.
- Unload firearm when not in use.
- Point a firearm only at something you intend to shoot.
- Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.
- Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.
- Don't drink alcoholic beverages before or during shooting.
