Phil Cardon has stepped down as Chair of the Grounds Committee, and we are in the process of finding a replacement for him. Phil did an outstanding job of keeping the equipment running, the grounds maintained, etc. Thanks, Phil, for your leadership and efforts.

On Friday, June 11, at 10:30am we will be having another Zoom TCSL RSO meeting in an effort to coordinate efforts of our RSO volunteers. The link to the Zoom meeting is on the on-line TCSL calendar. Please join us for the meeting. The Board approved a motion allowing TCSL RSOs to get double credit for volunteer hours worked this summer, and the double credit will count toward a free or reduced TCSL Range Pass for 2022.

Please follow the email blasts and monitor the TCSL online calendar. As of this writing, we expect that, on June 1, all outdoor restrictions will be removed; and as of July 1, *all* restrictions will be removed. As things open back up, we should see club rentals picking up again; and as that happens, our need for volunteers will increase again.

Work is continuing on the Trap Range, and the Range Sponsor Program will be picking up shortly. Lance is back and catching up on projects that weren't completed over the past year. In other words, TCSL has survived COVID-19, and our greatest asset (i.e., our membership) is continuing to help make this an awesome club—and continuing to look into new areas (axe-throwing ranges, for instance) to make it better.

Michigan United Conservation Clubs (MUCC) continues to work hard to advance the interests of the sporting community in Michigan. The *Conservation Insider* provides a regular source of information on MUCC's activities, programs, legislative involvement, as well as action alerts and announcements. The quarterly *Michigan Out-of-Doors* magazine is available online to all MUCC members—watch for the link in an MUCC email.

Recently MUCC shared the NRC announcement of the acquisition of the Crystal Waters 680-acre parcel of land near Milan that will be

open to hunting, fishing, trapping and other recreational activities. This project has been in the works for nearly a decade and has been strongly supported by MUCC and by many clubs in southeastern Michigan (MUCC Region 8). The DNR is now making plans to develop this land into a state game area that will have a wide variety of activities available, including hunting, boating, fishing, hiking, and more. MUCC Region 8 clubs and other area outdoor organizations will be invited to continue their support of Crystal Waters by joining in the work needed to prepare for the variety of potential activities. Our second standard Military Rifle Match for 2021 was held on Saturday May 15th at the 100-yard rifle range with 6 shooters.

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, June 26th, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful. The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone position for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing unsupported position. For the Slow fire portion single fed rounds are fired within 8 minutes, while rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match. **Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle.** For further information or questions contact Dave Vandermark at rifle@TCSL.org.

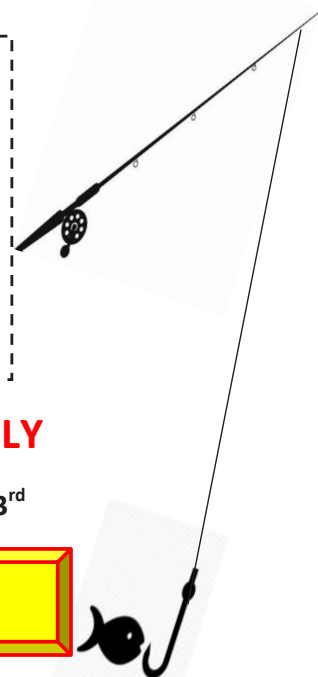

Inaugural Trench Match



On May 1, TCSL hosted its inaugural Trench Match. This was a new match, with new positions and requirements for shooters to navigate. Its purpose was to simulate shooting positions you might find yourself in defending your trench in World War I. It took place on the 100 yard rifle range, and was a 50 shot match, with 3 rounds:

Round 1 – Standing Position. 20 shots from a standing position, supported at 100 yards. Required 4 loading cycles that could vary in number of shots each (5-5-5-5, or 8-2-5-5, or 2-10-5-3, etc.). Timer starts with the rifle unloaded. Time limit: 100 seconds.

Round 2 – Kneeling position. 10 shots kneeling, supported at 100 yards. Required 2 loading cycles. Timer starts with the rifle unloaded. Time limit: 60 seconds.

Round 3 – Prone Position. This round was time limited to 100 seconds and allowed the shooter up to 20 shots to break 10 clay birds that were hung at 100 yards. Firing was in the prone position, supported using a rest provided. Required 4 loading cycles that could vary in number of shots each (5-5-5-5, or 8-2-5-5, or 2-10-5-3, etc.). Timer starts with the rifle unloaded. Points awarded based on the number of clays broken (5 per bird), with a 10-point bonus if all 10 are broken. The most any shooter broke was 7.

So . . . why is this called a trench match? The rests provided in rounds 1 & 2 are small ports in a mock trench wall, and the prone rest simulates an earthen berm. They are meant to not be comfortable positions. And to add to the difficulty, the rifle must have a bayonet attached during all firing.

Competitors found the time limits and multiple loading cycles a tougher hurdle than it would seem, with scores averaging around half what was possible. The bayonets made most rifles' point of aim interesting (being nice). Everyone had a good time, and there have been enough requests that **we will have another Trench Match on September 18 this year!**

Registration for DNR bear and elk hunt waiting-list is open through July 10

The Bear and Elk Hunt Transfer Program allows hunters who are successfully drawn for a bear or elk license to transfer their drawing success to an eligible person they know, or to an individual on the DNR hunt waiting list.

Those eligible to receive a hunt through the transfer program are:

- Youth hunters, up to 16 years of age, who applied for the current-year bear and elk drawings and were not selected for a license.
- Any person who has been diagnosed with an advanced illness. An application for a license in the current-year drawing is not required. Advanced Illness is defined by the Public Health Code and requires a Physician Certification of Advanced Illness.
- Complete the Registration for Bear and Elk Hunt Waiting List form by July 10 to be entered to receive a donated hunt in 2021.

Don't delay, apply for a license today!

The application periods for bear and elk are open now through June 1. Applications for a license, preference point or chance are \$5 and can be purchased at license retailers or online at mdnr-elicense.com.

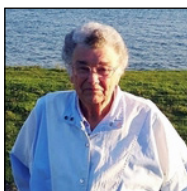

Rule Changes



(changes to TCSL rules since 2018)

1. Highly visible chamber safety flags are to be used on uncased firearms.
2. Targets may depict generic images of animals or monsters. Targets may not depict a generic human being and not a public figure, politician, head of state, religious figure, person in religious garb, or child.
3. At the Pistol House and Action Bays, all handguns of common handgun caliber may be used, as well as pistol caliber carbines (PCC) chambered in a caliber less than .45 Auto. No other longguns are allowed north of the creek, except for shotguns, as permitted by the Action Range Rules.
4. Drawing from a holster and moving while shooting is only allowed on the Action Range (a) during TCSL sanctioned events, (b) when under direct supervision of a Safety Officer, or (c) on Action Bays 2, 3, and 4 if the member has met the requirements for unsupervised drawing from holster and moving while shooting.
5. Use of personal mechanical clay target throwers (not handheld throwers) are allowed on the trap range when a TCSL Range Safety Officer is present. (*Applicable when the trap range is open*).
6. Multiple targets are allowed on the action bays.
7. Fully automatic firearms are not allowed at TCSL, regardless if they have a selector switch.
8. Binary triggers are not allowed at TCSL.
9. Bump stocks are not allowed at TCSL.
