President's Column

The September 16 TCSL Board and Membership meetings will be in person at the Clubhouse. Committee chairs will continue to decide how they want to conduct their meetings. If the Committee meetings are being conducted by Zoom, please check the online TCSL calendar since we are trying to post the links on the calendar. I look forward to having the Board and Membership meetings in person so that we can all catch up with each other. Keep in mind that you earn volunteer hours for attending the Board, Membership, and Committee meetings.

The Tier 3 IDPA match will be in September, so get in touch with Earl Austin to help with this event. This year's event will have a larger turnout then last year's, so extra volunteers will be needed. It is my understanding that the Tier 3 match will be the largest IDPA match in the State of Michigan this year. Please look at the online TSCL calendar and you will see the dates of all of the range closures. Monday, September 6, through Sunday, September 12, all of the pistol ranges will be closed for set-up, the match itself, and clean-up. Thursday, September 9, through Sunday, September 12, all of the rifle ranges will be closed for set-up, the match and clean-up. Keep checking the on-line calendar in case there are changes in these dates and closures.

The following dues increases were approved at the August 19 Board meeting:

Regular Member - \$170 per year Young Adults - \$85 per year Junior - \$24 per year Senior - \$85 per year Military (Active Duty) - Free Associate - \$24 per year

The Board also approved increasing the application fee to \$50 and the volunteer hour buy-out rate to \$15 per hour. Finally, due to the inability to conduct Women on Target, Kids on the Range Day, and hall rental for months during this year and concerns due to COVID, the Board also suspended the requirement that members have ten volunteer hours per year for 2021. Volunteers are still needed at TCSL events (i.e., weddings, high school reunions, IDPA matches, breakfasts, steak fries, etc.), and the hours earned will still be applied to the Discounted/Free Range Pass program; so please keep helping. The suspension is for the 2021 requirement, so effective December 1, 2021, the new volunteer hour requirement is fully reinstated for



2022 obligations. remind everyone that the purchase of volunteer hours has been a great help over the years, and eliminating the requirement that members purchase unearned hours will result in reduction in income for TCSL; so I encourage members to consider donating money to help cover this shortfall.

The TCSL Board also voted to extend the contract allowing York Township to use the TCSL facilities as a polling place for their elections. The actual election dates will be on the TCSL online calendar. TCSL has allowed York Township to use the TCSL facilities as a polling location for years, as we support our neighbors.

We are still in need of a Grounds Chair. Fall clean-up will be occurring, and it would be helpful to have a Grounds Chair in place to schedule and coordinate that activity. Please email me (steve@reedlawgrouppc.com) if you are interested in being the Grounds Chair.

Anyone interested in bidding on a contract for snow removal and salting on the property this winter should submit their bids to Carlos Soto, First Vice President at v1presdient@tcsl.org. Please get your submissions to Carlos by September 12. Feel free to get creative (i.e., a reduced cost but volunteer hours created for time spent on the project).

Saturday and Sunday, October 9 and 10, we will once again be offering the NRA Range Safety Officer and TCSL Range Safety Officer courses which are provided free to our Members. At the end of the weekend, each student will receive 16 volunteer hours; and upon successful completion of the course, they will have NRA RSO and TCSL RSO ratings. Those members helping teach the course will receive 16 volunteer hours. Normally, the NRA RSO course is \$75-150; however, TCSL members get the course at no cost as a benefit of their membership. The only cost is that students taking the courses need to also take the AED/CPR training which is provided during the course and \$40 is paid directly to the instructor (i.e., TCSL does not receive any portion of the \$40). Let me know if you want to take the RSO course or to assist teaching it (steve@reedlawgrouppc.com).

We are continuing to have an issue on ranges with baffles, support beams, etc. getting shot. We need to make sure this isn't happening since we don't want the property damaged, and we don't want rounds getting off property. Keep in mind that when you shoot, you need to hit the backstop. If you are shooting too fast and you aren't sure where your rounds are going, please slow down.

Since the ranges and facilities are fully open, spread the word that hall rental is once again available. Whether it is a wedding reception, family reunion, business meeting, etc., steer your friends and relatives to TCSL. Anyone interested should contact Mark Smokowicz (v2president@tcsl.org) to rent the clubhouse.

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on Saturday, October 16th, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone position for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the standing unsupported position. For the Slow fire portion single fed rounds are fired within 8 minutes, while rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match. Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle. Second Annual Cavalry Match Held

On July 31st, TCSL hosted it's second annual Cavalry Match. It's purpose was to simulate shooting positions you might find yourself in as a cavalry trooper in the late 1800's – on horseback, kneeling, firing from behind your horse, and using your pistol off-hand as a last resort. It took place on both the 50 and 100 yard rifle ranges. Each Shooter needed to bring a carbine (20" barrel or less, no scopes) that was capable of being single fed. Carbine stages included seated (on a rounded stool to simulate horseback), with 5 rounds facing the target, and 5 rounds facing perpendicular to the target at 50 yards, 10 rounds kneeling at 50 yards, and 10 rounds prone (but with an 18" high rest simulating a downed horse) at 100 yards. All three stages required the ammunition be single fed from a belt pouch and fired within 80 seconds. The pistol round was shot one-handed at 25 yards. When the timer started, the pistol was loaded with five rounds, fired, then loaded with 5 more rounds. This was done to make it more even between semi-auto pistols and revolvers (mags empty at start, only one mag allowed). All 10 rounds had to be fired within 80 seconds.

Scores were down this year because the pistol rounds proved to be difficult for all shooters. Look for the match again next year, date TBD.

50 Yard Rifle Range Damage

There has been a lot of recent damage on the 50-yard rifle range, particularly on the right side where we have the 25-yard targets set up. The support posts for the overhead pergola are being hit fairly regularly, to the point where one is going to need to be spliced. The overhead boards are also seeing a lot of hits, and we're seeing many skips halfway to the berm.

This is likely coming from standing, unsupported, rapid fire. Please remember to limit your rapid fire as much as possible, both for the club and the neighbors. And please mind your muzzle angles when you are firing; the damage is happening very close to the firing line. We cannot afford to damage the ranges, or to have any bullets get off property.

Lastly, if you observe a shooter not operating in a safe manner, please make them aware. Our club belongs to all our members, and we all have a responsibility to keep it safe.

MUCC Committee Report

Jim Pryce and I have been involved in a variety of activities with MUCC, the DNR, the Natural Resources Commission (NRC), and the newly-organized Wolf Management Advisory Council (WMAC).

In July, I attended the first public, in-person NRC meeting since COVID restrictions. It was held with all proper precautions, and it was good to see everyone in person. Topics included Fisheries Order Update, Cormorant Control, Restricting Beach Access, and the 2020 Preliminary Deer Harvest Survey report. I missed the August NRC meeting due to a fishing trip, but I have a draft copy of the July minutes if anyone is interested; and I will post a copy at the club. FYI: MUCC usually streams the NRC meetings on their Facebook page. The meeting can be watched live or at a later time

I attended the first WMAC meeting in Ishpeming on August 4. This group will try to find a way to control the negative impact that wolves are having in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. I have a draft copy of the meeting minutes if anyone is interested, and I will post a copy at the club. The next meeting is at Gaylord on Wednesday, September 1, and I plan to attend.

I also attended the Conservation Coalition that was held at the MUCC office in Lansing on August 20. The Conservation Coalition is made up of leaders from many of the largest conservation organizations in Michigan. The DNR Deputy Director introduced the new Wildlife Chief, Jared Duquette. I have a draft copy of the minutes of the meeting if anyone is interested, and I will post a copy at the club.

Jim and I will be attending the MUCC Convention from September 24-26. The Convention Book (which includes the proposed resolutions) is on the MUCC website (mucc.org). If you have a chance to look over the resolutions, we would be happy to discuss any comments or questions you may have. Jim and I will be reviewing the resolutions and will inform the club about any that might be of particular interest to TCSL members.

Closer to TCSL: the Crystal Waters land acquisition, just east of Milan, is still being finalized; we hope to soon be able to help with the work to prepare this area for a variety of outdoor activities. Also, the Pointe Mouillee Waterfowl Festival will be held on Saturday and Sunday, September 18 and 19. For more information visit www.ptemouilleewaterfowlfestival.org

Fall Handgun ("Running Deer") Shoots

Sundays: October 3, October 17, October 31 & November 7 Shooting Starts at 12:00 (noon) to 4:00pm

The "HANDGUN SHOOT" (Running Deer Shoot) is structured much the same as a good old Turkey Shoot as 10 individuals buy into a relay. All 10 take there turn shooting at the running deer. After each individual shoots, their score is totaled and radioed up to the officials' table. The highest score of the relay wins a prize.

The shooter is positioned 25 yards away from a hanging deer silhouette. The deer silhouette is positioned at the right side of the gallery. Round count and order may change from relay to relay. Our usual starting sequence is 2 shots at the deer standing still and 2 shots



while the deer is running. Once the final standing shot is fired, the deer will begin to move across the gallery from right to left.

This event is open to the public. This event is open to Handguns, .22 Rifles, and PCC's (Pistol Caliber Carbines). Pistols will compete against pistols; .22 Rifles and PPC's will compete among themselves. All type sights or optics are allowed.

This event is FUN, and it's OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. So bring a family member or a friend.
