### Handgun/Running Deer Shoot

Sundays: October 2, 16, 30 & November 6 Cost for each relay is \$5.00.

The "HANDGUN SHOOT" (Running Deer Shoot) is structured much the same as a good, old Turkey Ten individuals buy into a relay, and all ten take turns shooting at the running deer. After each individual shoots, their score is totaled and radioed up to the officials' table. The highest score of the relay wins a prize.

The shooter is positioned 25 yards away from a hanging deer silhouette, which is positioned at the right side of the gallery. Round count and order may change from relay to relay. Our usual starting sequence is 2 shots at the deer standing still and 2 shots while the deer is running. Once the final standing shoot is fired, the deer will begin to run across the gallery from right to left.

Firearms allowed: Handguns, .22 Rifles and PCCs (Pistol Caliber Carbines). Pistols will compete against pistols; .22 Rifles and PPCs will compete among themselves. All type of sights or optics are allowed.

This event is open to the public, and shooting starts at 12 noon. It's FUN! Bring a family member or a friend.

### **March Madness Rifle Match**

On Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, we held our second March Madness Match at the 100 yd rifle range with 7 shooters. What the heck is it? It is a 100 yd bench match using 22 LR rifles. Any scoped or iron-sighted 22LR rifle can be used. Each course for the match consisted of trying to break 10 clay birds at 100 yds using a maximum of 20 rounds of ammo. Each course was a maximum of 100 seconds long. Rifles were loaded with 5 rounds at a time maximum, and only one magazine could be used. The timer starts with the magazines empty, and rifle, magazines, and ammo in 5 round cups on the bench.

So what makes it a 'March Madness' match? Once all the shooters have signed in, we randomly drew numbers, which determined each shooter's place in a bracket system (seeding), just like the NCAA basketball tournament. Shooters then went through each course two at a time. The first shooter to break all the birds first, or break the most at the end of 100 seconds, moved on to the next round. This time around, we used a double-elimination bracket, so after your first loss, you traveled to another bracket to shoot your way back. We progressed through as many firing courses as necessary (13) until we had a winner.

Brad Orr was able to break all 10 birds during a round, and is the only person to do it so far. Good thing it wasn't cold; loading those .22 shells under time pressure was frustrating, and we all fumbled a bit. The score bracket is shown below. Only fully broken or birds with holes larger than a quarter counted as broken.

All shooters enjoyed the match again, so we will be doing it again next Spring. Keep your eye out on the calendar for it.

### Hunters Ed.

??WHAT'S NEW??

What's new is the way we can now interact with the DNR. You can now buy licenses, permits, check regulations, view maps, check drawing results, and more all from the palm of your hand. Download the new DNR app, Michigan DNR Hunt Fish at <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/dnr/things-to-do/hunting/huntfishmi">https://www.michigan.gov/dnr/things-to-do/hunting/huntfishmi</a>

Also, new (don't shoot the messenger) is mandatory deer harvest reporting. Beginning this year, deer hunters are required to report a successful harvest within 72 hours or before transferring possession of the deer (to another person, a processer, or taxidermist). Hunters must continue to attach a paper kill tag to a harvested deer. The kill tag should remain with the head if the head and body of the deer are separated. Anyone in possession of a deer after the harvest reporting timeframe expires should be able to present the confirmation number. For more info go to Deer harvest reporting FAQs.

What's not new is tree stand safety. Since 1997, hunting rules have allowed firearm hunting from raised platforms. Saturday, October 1, is the opener of bow season; and hunters will be hunting from all kinds of elevated devices. Know your equipment and how to be safe using them. Always use a safety harness, and remember the three Rs: recover, relief, and rescue. Find more info at Tree Stand Safety Awareness Foundation -TSSA. Practice with someone at ground level to become familiar with your equipment before the season starts. If you harvest a deer this year, share a tastefully done photo with us by sending it to Newsletter@tcsl.org, and it may be posted in a newsletter.

Be a responsible and safe hunter.
