Our next 185 Yard Bench Match will be held on TBD in Fall 2023, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at **10am**. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with **ANY** rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope, as long as you can fire the 10 rounds in 10 minutes. You will need 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, and ear protection. Spotting scopes are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (10) rounds of slow fire from the bench for sight-in within 10 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire from the bench within 8 minutes. Shooters may elect to use their score from the sight-in stage, but in doing so would forfeit shooting the 2nd round.

Hunters Education Four Primary Rules of Firearm Safety

- Always keep firearm pointed in a safe direction. Never point your gun at anything you do not intend to shoot.
- 2. Treat all guns as though they are loaded.
- 3. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot, and remove it from the trigger after the shot.
- 4. Always be sure of your target and what's beyond it.
