Safety is our primary goal. During the new member orientation, the importance of hitting the backstop is repeatedly emphasized. Muzzle control is a key to that goal. A muzzle that is horizontal and perpendicular to the berm essential. Small deviations at the firing line are compounded down range. Target placement that is correct for the firing position on the firing line is another key. Ensure that the target is at the proper height with your simulated arm and finger firearm prior to firing. Rapid fire is discouraged. Deliberate and steady trigger movement helps to ensure a horizontal and perpendicular muzzle.

# President's Column

Club range hours begin Monday through Saturday at 10am and on noon on Sunday. Range activity closes at the earlier of sunset or 8 pm. The time of sunset is posted near the range sign in book. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Highest score wins. Bring 20 rounds of safe ammunition, safety or shooting glasses, hearing protection, registration fee and appropriate warm clothing. A spotting scope is useful, and you may also bring rests or other positioning gear. Some blocks and sandbags are available. No rear bags or rests will be used.

A meeting of the MUCC Region 8 Affiliate Clubs was held on Saturday, February 28, at the Maybee Sportsman's Club. Jim Pryce, Stuart Berry, and I attended. The meeting included a preview of the upcoming MUCC Annual Convention scheduled for March 24-26 at the Comfort Inn in Mt. Pleasant.
