President's Column

Congratulations to all the volunteers who worked so hard to plan, coordinate and conduct June's Women on Target event. The day was a success. We had participants on all the ranges from Archery to Action Bay 5. The coaching was one on one. The skills practiced and gained were bow, shotgun, rifle and a large variety of handguns. The targets were paper bulls eyes, paper plates with glued on candy and paintballs, hanging clays, oscillators and bowling pins painted for the day's guests. We all gathered in the clubhouse prior to range time, at lunch and post shooting for refreshment, story telling and raffles.

Carol Grubb coordinated WOT again this year. Thanks, Carol for your leadership. Each range had a leader and coaches helping the women. The food, kitchen, and volunteer dinner were coordinated by Sue and Mark Smokowicz. The grounds were spiffed up by our Grounds Chair Pete Stumpo, aided by Tim Grapentien, Professor Phil, and many more. The planning leading up to the day included procuring sponsors, coordinating coaches, acquiring ammo, preparing the targets, setting up the ranges, all the administrative duties, and preparing food and refreshments. Then the ranges had to be cleaned and prepared for return to member general usage. Thanks to each and every volunteer. We can't do it without you.

Look for the sponsors' ads in the newsletters and on the ranges. They help make the day possible. Consider patronizing our sponsors with your support. We have to look out for each other.

And next we will assemble on July 15 for Kids on the Range Day. kord@tcs1.org We are always looking for help, back ups, or understudies. It is better to have too much help than too little. The next KORD planning meeting is Wednesday, July 5 in the clubhouse. All volunteers for KORD need to complete the ICHAT background check. Visit that site at <https://apps.michigan.gov/#>, and follow the login prompts to log in or complete as a guest.

After KORD, the final big event of the year is the [IDPA Challenge Match](#) in early September. Help is needed for this event.

Always check the [calendar](#) before you come to the ranges. These larger events close ranges to general membership for a few to many days. It is better to plan ahead then come to the range and be disappointed.

An interesting wrinkle came up on the planning for WOT. This period of excessive lack of rain presents us with very dry grounds. The concerns of a ground fire become elevated. Situational awareness now includes being observant of a ground fire. Plan ahead as to what an escape route may be and have a secondary route. Don't get trapped in a range by the backstop and safety walls. Secure firearms and ammo. Alert others and help as needed. Call for help and direct first responders.

[July's calendar](#) includes many education classes, including RSO training (July 8), basic pistol, instructor, and other classes. Sign up early as many classes have a minimum number of students required to hold the class. The previous RSO class was cancelled because we did not have the required minimum. Pin shoots continue (July 9 and 30). Rifle matches continue on Saturday, July 29, and now a Thursday evening date (July 6). IDPA holds its monthly match on July 22 and practice nights each Tuesday evening. Finance and Safety hold their meetings on Zoom (July 17), and the Board meeting is the on the third Thursday (July 20). You are invited to join these

business meetings. Get involved and earn volunteer hours. There is no membership meeting in July, nor a burger night. You are welcome to brown bag it before the Board meeting. But again, the big event in July is KORD (July 15).

Earlier this year Val Kabat applied for a grant from the NRA Foundation to purchase youth sized rifles. We were awarded \$1100. The Board voted to allocate those funds to apply for purchase of 5 Mark I GY .22 LR rifles from Savage Arms of Suffield, CT through their Youth Shooting Sports Program at a 40% discount from retail. We have contacted Savage Arms and are in the process of getting approval to order the rifles. Once approved, we will complete the formal purchase order, make payment and wait. A Savage Arms' document gives a delivery time frame of "approximately 52+" weeks. Thanks to Val, Jon Yost, and Dave Vandermark for completing the grant documents and providing guidance for suitable rifles to meet our needs.

The walk-in cooler behind the bar has been repaired and is now operational. This comes in quite handy now that the summer's bigger events are upon us. We don't have to stuff everything into the kitchen cooler and crawl over the inventory to get what we need. It is a back-up in case the kitchen cooler gets any funny ideas (shh!). The contractor was Altech Mechanical off Jackson Road in Ann Arbor.

We are looking for a Kitchen Chair and trainees for the Second VP office. The various kitchen and hall rental events can always use more hands. These events put the Tri-County face out to the membership and the public. The hall is a wonderful asset that we can use to our benefit.

Fourth Annual Cavalry Match Held

On June 17, TCSL hosted its fourth annual Cavalry Match. Its purpose was to simulate shooting positions you might find yourself in as a cavalry trooper in the late 1800s—on horseback, kneeling, firing from behind your horse, and using your pistol off-hand as a last resort. It took place on both the 50- and 100-yard rifle ranges. Each shooter needed to bring a carbine (20" barrel or less, no scopes) that was capable of being single fed. Carbine stages included seated (on a rounded stool to simulate horseback), with 5 rounds facing the target, and 5 rounds facing perpendicular to the target at 50 yards, 10 rounds kneeling at 50 yards, and 10 rounds prone (but with an 18"-high rest simulating a downed horse) at 100 yards. All three stages required the ammunition to be single fed from a belt pouch and fired within 80 seconds. The pistol round was shot one-handed at 25 yards. When the timer started, the pistol was loaded with five rounds, fired, then loaded with 5 more rounds. This was done to make it more even between semi-auto pistols and revolvers (mags empty at start, only one mag allowed). All 10 rounds had to be fired within 80 seconds.


Shooting starts at 12:00 noon.

Hunter Education

If you or someone you know is planning to hunt this year or even if you are just thinking you might be interested in hunting.

To purchase a hunting license in Michigan, an individual born on or after January 1, 1960, is required to successfully complete an approved hunter education course.

There are three options for completing hunter education in Michigan:

1. A traditional classroom-based course + in-person field day (typically included as part of the classroom course)
2. An online course + in-person field day.
3. A take home study course + in-person field day.

At TCSL we offer the online course + in-person field day. We have an event coming up on August 12 from 8:00am to 5:10pm.

About this Event:

Registration opens on July 15. On event day, bring a copy of online certificate/field day voucher, eye and ear protection for shooting, drink, and lunch for the half-hour break. Ours is an outdoor range, so dress for the weather that day. Class fee is \$8.00 (cash preferred). Do not bring guns or ammunition, they will be provided. Class starts promptly at 8am. Be early to sign in and get seated. A 50-question test is given at the end of the day, so be prepared. We encourage parents or hunting partners to come and sit in on the class at no charge. They can't help in the test or shoot, but they might have fun; and it is a good refresher. Guests should bring the same essentials (less certificate and cash).
