TLC for the TCSL Flagpole

Over the years, both the flagpole had become worn, and the flag had become tattered. That wasn't the image we wanted our visitors to see when they drove onto the property—especially with so many special events coming up.

Vic Chevrette made a valiant effort to replace the flag with another 3' x 5' flag, but the halyard (rope) broke, and he discovered how rusty the flagpole had become.



Happily, the Bowling Pin Shoot Crew (Jim Walter, Rick Parsons, Mike Cowhy, Tom Hammonds, Nancy Lindemann, Vic Chevrette, and Carol Grubb) took on the project and were able to meet their goal of having the U.S. flag flying by the 4th of July.

It turned out to be quite a process. The flagpole was lowered (laid down on the ground!), all the old hardware was removed, and the flagpole was cleaned of rust from top to bottom using battery drills and wire wheels. The flagpole was then primed, and a coat of Rust-Oleum Aluminum paint was applied.

After the truck assembly, 3-inch top ornament ball, and halyard were installed, the flagpole was raised into position and secured. More hardware was installed, and two new, larger flags were installed: 5" x 8' U.S. flag and a new 4' x 6' Michigan flag.

It's now a beautiful addition to our TCSL grounds, and something we all can be proud of when visitors enter the property!

11:30am until 4:00pm (or until we run out of shooters)
Shooting starts at 12:00noon.

The cost for each relay (20 pins = 5 pins x 4 tables) is \$5.00.

The shooter stands 20 yards away from a structure, with 5 bowling pins on it. A safety officer, with a timer, will give the command to commence firing, at which time the shooter will begin shooting until all 5 pins are knocked down. The time it takes to knock 5 pins down is recorded. Bragging rights are determined by the shooter's lowest score. If you don't own a PCC or .22 rifle and would like to participate, there are several members on site who are willing to loan you their .22 rifle for this event.

A safety officer with a timer will give the command to commence firing, at which time the shooter will begin shooting until all 5 pins are knocked down. The time it takes to knock 5 pins down is recorded. Bragging rights are determined by the shooter's lowest score (time). If you don't own a handgun, PCC or .22 rifle and would like to participate, there are several members on site who are willing to loan you their .22 handgun or rifle for this event.

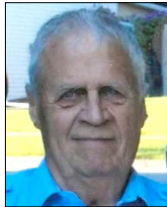
Memorial & Wellbeing Celebration & Thanks

Grounds Report

Hurray! As of July 3, the flowerbed project is now finished! Four patio beds have been cleared of stumps, roots, dead trees, and tall weeds were removed; and the patio beds have been sprayed and mulched. All surrounding areas in the patio have also been sprayed. After all weeds in the patio area die off, and go away—which may take some time—we can consider adding plants to the patio bed if we'd like.

During all of the flowerbed work, the gazebo job was started too. It was another huge and difficult job. All the work took four days of digging, cutting back, removing brush, and pulling stumps. We were fortunate that Jerry Marken loaned us his loader tractor for some of the most difficult parts of the flowerbed job.

Another stroke of good luck was when a new member of the Grounds Crew brought his loader tractor for the last day of the gazebo work. The loader, along with four good helpers (Daniel Scott, Fred Girbach, Rob Grubb, and myself), turned a week's worth of back-breaking work into an hour and a half of manageable work. Thank goodness! The ground around the gazebo is now cleared and leveled. (The shingles have also been sprayed for mold and mildew).

Fred and Laura Girbach have finished the mulching and planting around the gazebo, and it looks fabulous! We are truly fortunate to have Laura's expertise and the resources of her KBK Garden Center! A huge THANK YOU also goes to all the volunteers who helped on this project: Chris Leite, Stefan Graf, Kathy Graf, Fred Girbach, Laura Girbach, Gerry Eaton, Nicole Kruike, Daniel Scott, and Rob Grubb.

Honorable mention goes to: Don Hasselbach, Jerry Marken, Phil Cardon, and Carol Grubb, for bringing equipment, helping with clean-up, and finishing up the project.

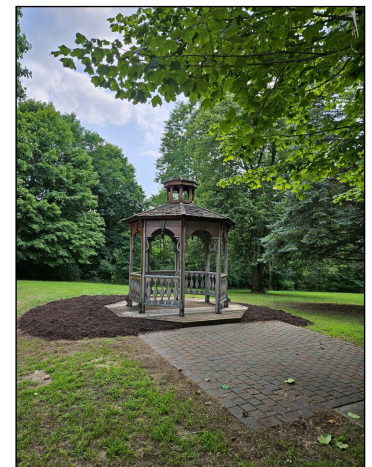
