

I need to be honest with you about our situation: Some of the feedback has been difficult, but fair. There is a perception that MUCC has, at times, lost focus and hasn't always represented all Michigan outdoorsmen and women equally. Whether fully accurate or not, we must address it.

My commitment is simple: MUCC will return to being the unified voice for all conservationists. We will represent everyone with the Michigan Legislature, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and the Michigan Natural Resources Commission.

What We're Doing

We've identified clear priorities, including:

- Science-based wildlife and fisheries management
- Habitat and public land stewardship
- Sustainable funding
- Partnerships and volunteer engagement
- Youth education and public access
- Support for programs like Sportsmen Against Hunger

We are also committing to greater focus, efficiency, and financial responsibility.

What Your Support Will Deliver

- Finalize and implement a restructuring plan
- Rebuild trust and communication
- Re-establish a unified voice in Lansing
- Strengthen core conservation programs
- Create a sustainable financial path forward

The Reality

We are in a position that requires immediate action. The Executive Board has committed to personally leading this effort and raising the funds necessary to move MUCC forward. We must raise \$100,000 by May 1st to stabilize Michigan United Conservation Clubs and complete this transition. We have already raised \$14,000 toward that goal.

This is a critical moment. Without reaching this goal, MUCC will not be able to continue operating. Simply put, we will be forced to close our doors. We have a clear path forward—but only if we have the resources to get there.

Military Rifle Match Held

Our first standard Military Rifle Match for 2026 was held on Saturday April 18th at the 100-yard rifle range with 5 shooters.

Our next Military Rifle Match will be held on June 13th, and is open to all TCSL members and guests. Registration starts at 9am and the match begins at 10am. A short safety briefing will be held prior to the match. Fees for the match will be \$10 for members and \$15 for guests. You can compete with any military style rifle (no full autos), foreign or domestic, modern or vintage, with iron sights or scope. You will need 45 rounds of safe ammunition, a shooting mat or something to lie on, safety or shooting glasses and ear protection. Spotting scopes and sling are helpful.

The course of fire for the event shall be: (5) rounds of slow fire in the prone position for sight-in within 5 minutes. For score; (10) rounds slow fire in the prone position, (10) rounds of rapid fire in the prone position, (10) rounds rapid fire in the sitting position and (10) rounds of slow fire in the standing un-supported position. For the Slow fire portion single fed rounds are fired within 8 minutes, while rapid fire is within 80 seconds with a magazine or stripper clip change. There will be a short safety briefing prior to the match. Please Note: You need not be a military member to compete, as they are surely welcome, you only need to own a military style rifle.

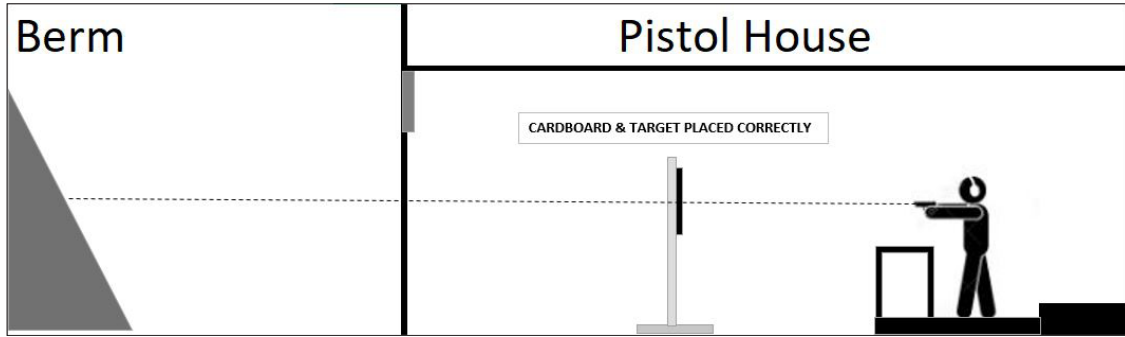

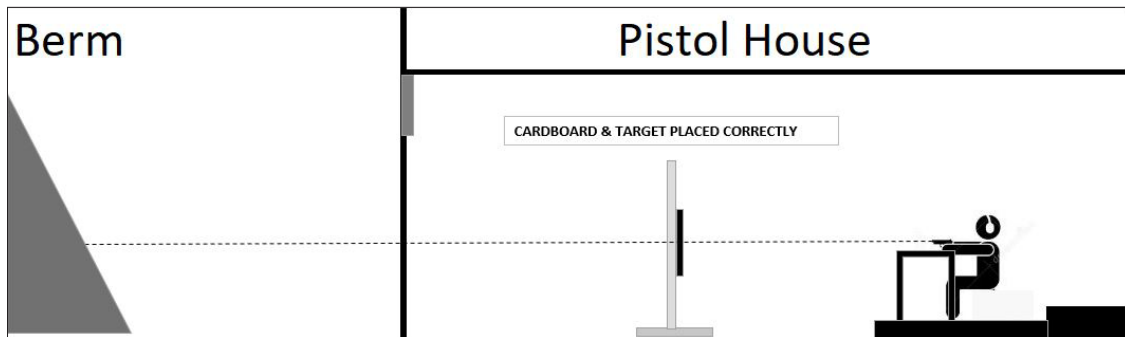
Target Alignment: A Top Priority!

At Tri-County target placement and sight alignment are very important to the overall safety of our ranges. Knowing your target and what is behind it is one of the fundamentals of safe shooting.

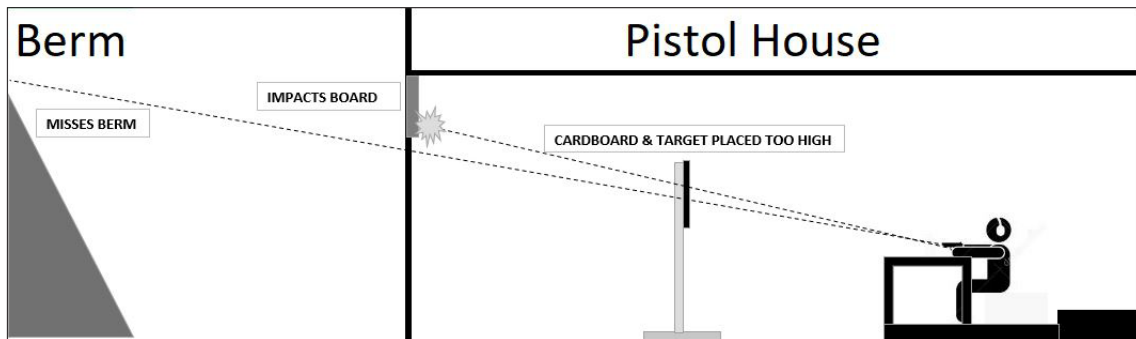
In the Pistol House we strive to place the cardboard target backers at the correct standing positions for average shooters, however people come in all sizes.



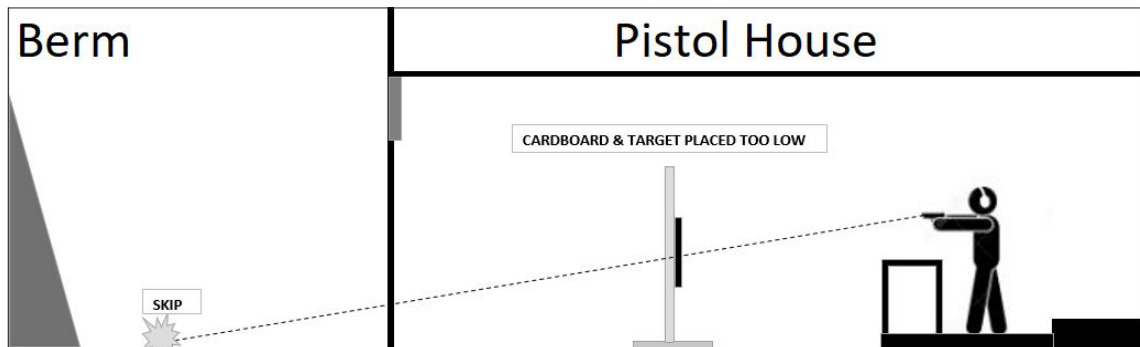
Many people enjoy shooting while seated or sighting in their pistols using a bench rest. This requires the cardboard and target to be placed at a lower position to properly impact the berm.



It is very important to remember to lower the cardboard and target to ensure proper target alignment, failing to do so can result in damage to the building or missing the berm entirely.



We ask that if you lower the cardboard for sitting you replace it to the original higher position when you have completed shooting. Shooters have been observed negligently shooting at low cardboard from a standing position. Remember you must always check your target alignment to prevent skips, this is especially important in the winter when the ground may be frozen.
